# Admission Requirements and Procedures

- 1. A person holding a Bachelor's Degree.
- 2. At least one year of ministerial experience.
- 3. Successful submission of all the required documents cited in the admission form.

## Degree Requirements and Policy

1. Completion of 45 credit hours, including all required courses;

- 2. Attainment of cumulative grade point average of 3.00/4.00.
- 3. A campus visit is required for intensive courses and hands-on tutoring for project writing upon graduation.

- 4. Fulfillment of all degree requirements in not more than four calendar years from the first term of enrollment. Students who for one reason or another cannot finish his/her study within the stipulated period should petition the Academic Dean for the extension. Under normal circumstances, six months extension can be granted. Any extension beyond that will be done upon the evaluation of the student's performance by the faculty. In any case, it should be noted that under no circumstances the duration of study for this MA degree shall exceed five calendar years from the year of enrolment.
- 5. A student shall write a project paper on an area of their interest after the completion of four quarters from the time of his/her enrolment in KHTS.
- 6. M.A.M. degree will not be conferred if a student's total grade point average falls below 2.0.
- 7. KHTS fees are set as follows: 18,000 THB per year for a person living in Thailand, Myanmar, or the Thai-Myanmar borders, and 1800 USD per year for overseas students.
